Digital cellular phone service

- Direct Connect, the nationwide and country-to-country instant walkie-talkie service that connects users to each other in under a second
- Group Connect<sup>SM</sup>, the new service which allows users to communicate with up to 20 other Nextel users nationwide, all at once with the touch of a button, and to set it all up quickly and easily from their handset.
- Direct Talk, which allows users who are outside of the coverage area to manually transfer to a two-way radio-to-radio communication mode with a range of up to six miles depending upon specific conditions, such as terrain.

send text, images and audio together, allowing a high level of expression and personalization

The phone also offers a variety of personalization options, including user-assignable ring tones, wallpaper designs, and navigation shortcuts, at an additional fee.
