

Appeals court considers ban on stem cell research

(AP) -- The Obama administration has told an appeals court that a judge's order halting federal funding of stem cell research would result in destruction of valuable biological materials and set back taxpayer-funded work.

A three-judge panel of the Court of Appeals in Washington is considering whether to throw out a lower court judge's ban on President Barack Obama's rules for federal funding of human embryonic <u>stem cell</u> <u>research</u>.

The judge had temporarily blocked Obama's rules because he said it's likely they violate the law on federal funding of embryo destruction.

The <u>appeals court</u> judges on Monday questioned whether the disruption of the research would irreparably harm the government's work or just delay it while the case proceeds.
