


## Image: C3-class solar flare erupts on Sept. 8, 2010

Just as sunspot 1105 was turning away from Earth on Sept. 8, the active region erupted, producing a C3-class solar flare (peak @ 2330 UT) and a fantastic prominence.

Just as <u>sunspot</u> 1105 was turning away from Earth on Sept. 8, the active region erupted, producing a <u>solar flare</u> and a fantastic prominence. The eruption also hurled a bright coronal mass ejection into space. The



eruption was not directed toward any planets.
