

NASA: Astronaut hurt in bicycle accident

NASA did not release more details about Kopra's injury, citing privacy concerns.

The 47-year-old Kopra lives in Houston and is a retired Army colonel. He was one of two astronauts scheduled to go on a <u>spacewalk</u> during Discovery's mission to the space station.

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
