Bank of America customers hoping to pay their monthly bills struggled to access online accounts Tuesday, as the United States' biggest bank reported website disruptions.

Amid the beginning-of-the-month rush to pay household expenses, <u>Bank</u> of <u>America</u> suffered "intermittent online disruption" according to spokesperson Tara Burke.

Customers trying to access their accounts on the company's <u>website</u> received a message that "online banking is temporarily unavailable."



Burke said the slowdown was "a result of a routine update we did over the week-end," insisting there was no breach of bank security.

"This was not the result of any form of attack," she said.

"There was no impact on customer information or compromised customer <u>security</u>."

The firm claims to have 57 million individual and small business customers.
