

Report: Global cyberattack under way for 5 years

(AP) -- A computer security firm says cybercriminals have spent at least the past five years targeting more than 70 government entities, nonprofit groups and corporations to steal troves of data.

McAfee Inc. said in a report Wednesday that the attacks have targeted a broad range of organizations, including the United Nations, the International Olympic Committee and companies in mostly in the United States.

[McAfee](#) did not say who may be behind the attacks but says the culprit is likely a nation state.

The report is short on specifics, as the [security firm](#) is not naming most of the victims or exactly what data were stolen. Most of the victims are in the U.S., with a few in Canada, [South Korea](#), Taiwan, Japan and elsewhere.
