

McAfee adds protection for mobile gadgets

Computer security firm McAfee on Tuesday will launch a service that unifies defenses for computers, smartphones and tablets.

Computer security firm McAfee on Tuesday will launch a service that unifies defenses for computers, smartphones and tablets.

McAfee billed AllAccess as an unprecedented offering for coordinated protection of desktop, laptop and <u>netbook</u> computers along with smartphones or tablets powered by <u>Android</u>, Symbian, or Blackberry operating systems.

"Most consumer households now own a combination of PCs, Macs, and mobile devices, but haven't kept up-to-date by adequately protecting all of them," said McAfee co-president Todd Gebhart.

AllAccess lets users manage security, limit Internet surfing, and back up



data on devices from a central console.

It is priced at \$99 for one person and \$149 for a household version.

McAfee announced the new service along with the results of a global study that found people placed an average value of \$37,438 on their total "digital assets," including pictures and music collections.
