

Shuttles come nose to nose

NASA's space shuttles Endeavour and Atlantis switched locations today at Kennedy Space Center in Florida, and in the process came "nose-tonose" for the last time in front of Orbiter Processing Facility 3.

Endeavour was moved from Orbiter Processing Facility 2 to the Vehicle Assembly Building where it will be housed temporarily until its targeted



departure from Kennedy atop the <u>Shuttle Carrier Aircraft</u> in mid-September. After a stop at the Los Angeles International Airport, Endeavour will move in mid-October to the California Science Center for permanent public display.

Now in the processing facility after leaving the Vehicle Assembly Building, <u>shuttle Atlantis</u> will undergo preparations for its move to the <u>Kennedy Space Center</u> Visitor Complex in November, with a grand opening planned for July 2013.
