

ACLU will appeal NY NSA phone surveillance ruling

A civil rights lawyer says the American Civil Liberties Union is very disappointed that a New York judge has found that a <u>government</u> <u>program that collects millions of Americans' telephone records is legal.</u>

Attorney Brett Max Kaufman said the ACLU will appeal Friday's ruling by federal Judge William Pauley in Manhattan. The judge concluded that the program was legal and a valuable part of the nation's efforts to combat the threat of terrorism. The judge said the phone collection program only works because it collects everything.

Kaufman said he hopes a <u>federal appeals court</u> in New York agrees with the reasoning of a Washington D.C. <u>federal judge</u> who concluded earlier this month that the program likely violates the Constitution.
