

HP raises CEO Whitman's salary to \$1.5M from \$1

Hewlett-Packard is giving CEO Meg Whitman a huge pay raise as she enters the third year of her attempt to turn around the slumping personal computer and printer maker.

Regulatory documents filed Tuesday disclose that Whitman's <u>annual salary</u> is soaring to \$1.5 million from \$1. The raise is retroactive to Nov. 1, the start of HP's fiscal year.

Whitman is a billionaire who had agreed to limit her salary to \$1 annually when HP hired her as CEO in September 2011. The sacrifice came as HP prepared to eliminate nearly 30,000 jobs to offset a drop in revenue from declining PC sales amid a shift to mobile computers.

HP's revenue is still falling, but the company's stock has risen by 20 percent since Whitman took over.
