

For a good cause, group offers real bird's eye view of Dubai

Now that's a real bird's eye view.

A <u>conservation group</u> offered it Saturday by attaching a small video camera to the back of Darshan, an <u>eagle</u> who took off from the top of Dubai's Burj Khalifa, the world's tallest tower.

Darshan flew some 830 meters (2,700 feet), offering a breathtaking view of the commercial capital of the United Arab Emirates. His view, cruising alongside the Burj Khalifa, was viewed live by those on the ground—including his roller-coaster dive onto a man's arm on the ground.

Freedom Conservation put on the show. They say they did it to draw more attention to eagle conservation.
