

Big CAT scan: LSU mascot Mike the Tiger in cancer treatment

Call it a big CAT scan.

Louisiana State University's live tiger mascot was sedated this past



weekend and brought to a human cancer center near campus where he'll be treated for a <u>rare cancer</u>.

At the hospital, Mike VI received a CT scan and a radiation simulation. During the simulation, <u>doctors</u> set up devices that will keep the 420-pound tiger in position for precisely targeted radiotherapy to treat a tumor on his face.

The LSU veterinary school says in a statement that doctors haven't yet decided whether to treat Mike on one day or over two or three days. They say that without treatment Mike could live one or two months, but treatment could extend that to one or two years.

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
