

Big Ten to broadcast Minnesota-Nebraska in virtual reality

The Big Ten network is making Saturday's football game between Minnesota and No. 21 Nebraska available in virtual reality.

BTN released a statement on Thursday saying it has partnered with VOKE, a virtual reality provider that will use four, 180-degree HD cameras to bring a new perspective to the game. The game will also be available by regular broadcast on the Big Ten network.

To access the <u>virtual reality</u> version of the game, users must download VOKE's GearVR app and use a Gear VR headset and Samsung mobile phone.
