Natural disasters drive at least 26 million people into poverty each year, according to a World Bank report

Natural disasters drive at least 26 million people into poverty each year and cause more than \$500 billion in lost consumption, far exceeding the value of damage to property alone, according to a World Bank report released Monday.



Those numbers will be driven up in the coming decades as <u>climate</u> <u>change</u> amplifies the destructive power of cyclones, flooding and drought, said the report, released on the margins of high-level UN climate talks in Marrakesh.
