

## Cincinnati Zoo says premature hippo gets some mother's milk

The Cincinnati Zoo says a prematurely born baby hippo is getting some



of her mother's milk.

The zoo says the calf born early Tuesday is getting stronger, helped in part by <u>nutrients</u> she's now taking by bottle from milk collected from her 17-year-old mother Bibi. Zoo spokeswoman Michelle Curley said Friday the milk is supplemented with formula prepared by the zoo's nutritionist.

The zoo says 17-year-old Bibi gave birth six weeks early to the first Nile hippo born there in 75 years. The <u>calf</u> was 29 pounds at birth, well below the normal range of <u>birth weight</u> of 55 to 120 pounds and was unable to stand to nurse.

Nutritionist Barbara Henry says some of Bibi's milk will be analyzed and added to the Smithsonian's National Zoo milk repository.
