

Study reveals high relationship quality in same-sex couples

A new *Family Relations* study provides robust evidence against deeprooted social perceptions of same-sex relationships being conflictual, unhappy, and dysfunctional.

In the study of 25,348 individuals in the United Kingdom and 9,206 individuals in Australia, the level of relationship quality reported by gay/lesbian people was as high as that reported by heterosexual people in the United Kingdom, and higher in Australia.

The lowest <u>relationship quality</u> in both countries was reported by bisexual individuals.

"In countries such as Australia, <u>same-sex couples</u> and their families are being subjected to intense public scrutiny. This study provides timely evidence to combat erroneous stereotypes, demonstrating that these are loving, happy and functional couples," said co-author Dr. Francisco Perales, of The University of Queensland, in Australia.
