

Carnegie Mellon offers new artificial intelligence major

Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh will offer the nation's first undergraduate degree program in artificial intelligence.

Officials with the <u>school</u> announced Thursday the new major will be available to students enrolled in the School of Computer Science starting in the fall.

Many American universities offer an artificial <u>intelligence</u> track within degree programs like Computer Science and Computer Engineering.

But Carnegie Mellon is the first school to offer a distinct undergraduate major in artificial intelligence.

The university was a pioneer in <u>artificial intelligence</u> research, writing some of the first AI programs in the 1950s, and has remained among the top schools to study the field.
