

## World pledges \$4B in push to repair COVID's education damage

International governments and companies have pledged more than \$4 billion to educate 175 million children around the world and prevent a generation's chances being blighted by the coronavirus pandemic.

The commitments came Thursday at a <u>conference</u> in London hosted by Britain, Kenya and funding organization the Global Partnership for Education.

Former Australian Prime Minister Julia Gillard, who chairs the <u>partnership</u>, said the donations put it on track to meet its goal of raising \$5 billion over the next five years,

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson, who addressed the conference alongside Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta, has made girls' education a flagship project of his Conservative government, and is pushing to get 40 million more girls in school around the world by 2026.

He told conference delegates that <u>education</u> was "the silver bullet ... that can solve virtually every problem that afflicts humanity."

Britain has pledged 430 million pounds (\$600 million) to the Global Partnership for Education. But Johnson is facing criticism for slashing the U.K.'s international development budget from 0.7% of national income to 0.5%, cutting around 4 billion pounds (\$5.6 billion) from projects that help the world's most vulnerable.

The <u>government</u> says the cut is temporary and is necessary because of the economic blow caused by the pandemic.
