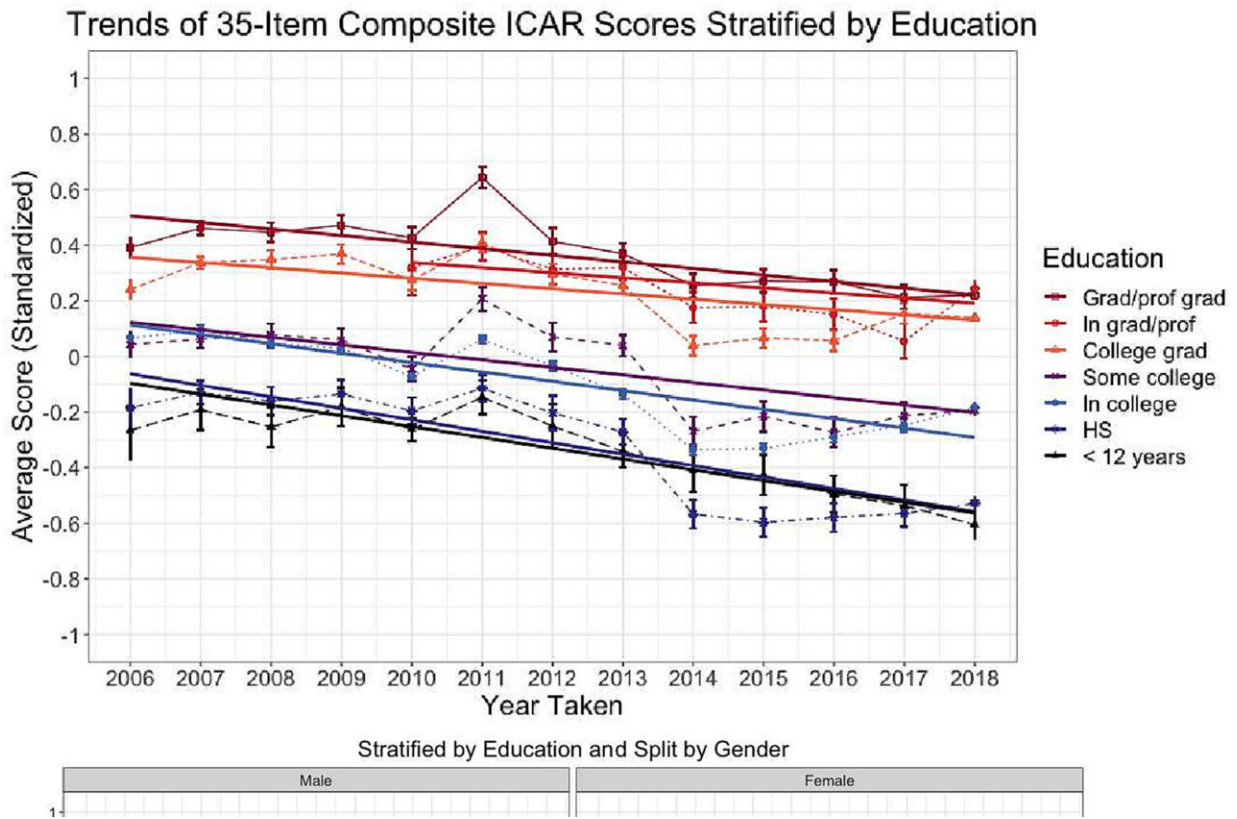


Online tests suggest IQ scores in US dropped for the first time in nearly a century
