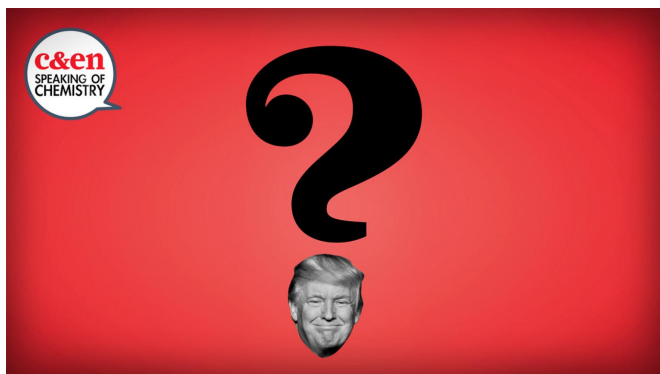


Video: What might Trump mean for chemistry?
