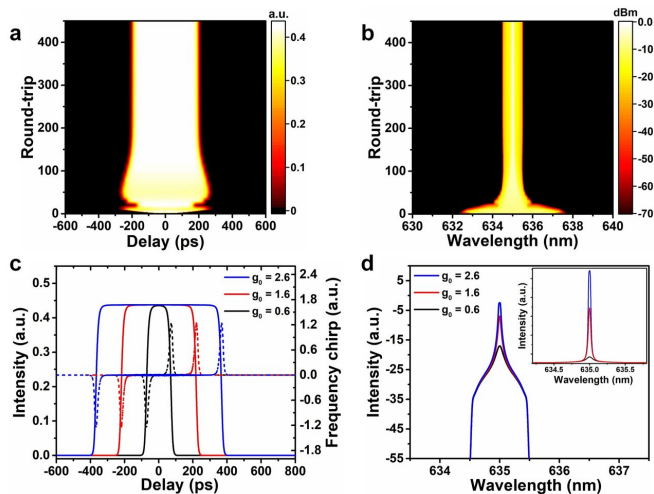


Towards visible-wavelength passively mode-locked lasers in all-fibre format
